Make-Up News Analysis

This assignment is intended to allow you to make-up the points for a missed, in-class News Analysis (not Newsweek or some similar news publication; we're talking the video segments we watch on the screen).

Directions:

Watch three news segments from the sources outlined below (you may choose the source). For each segment:

Provide the name of the segment, the date of the segment (or, at least the date which it was posted), and the source of the news segment (Associated Press, MSNBC, NBC Nightly News, ABC News online, etc.).

Provide a summary of the segment's content. This summary should be, at minimum, three sentences. (For maximum grade possibilities, the suggestion is to be as detailed as possible in your summary; however, three sentences is the minimum requirement.)

For each segment, develop a **Level Two** question, in accordance with the "Levels of Questioning" guidelines.

Answer the level two question that you have designed, as completely as possible. Again, the three sentence rule comes into play here; three sentences is the minimum requirement, but going further in the development of your answer can certainly help move your grade on the analysis in the direction that you wish.

You are restricted to choosing "hard news" segments. This includes any segment having to do with politics, social issues, court rulings, domestic policy, government issues, the war in Iraq, and such.
